
State and Cascade Island Landscaping Idea Barb Kruse and Marilyn Loser 2012 August 20 Amended 2013 April 30

- 1. Goals: Attractive, low maintenance, safe viewing, drip irrigation
- 2. Trees will take a LONG time to reach the listed sizes (if ever)
- 3. Junipers are shown under mature tree size, but will fill in for the first many years and water in these areas will help tree roots expand.
- 4. Flower beds: neighbors have offered to take care of them. Barb will donate Iris, Marilyn will donate Autumn Joy.
- 5. Shrubs: Russian Sage and Apache Plume are fairly airy and not as dense as cinequefoil and do well in Alamosa.
- 6. Rocks: Interesting rocks please the eye and don't take any maintenance. For sure one sitting rock along sidewalk and as many others as possible.
- 7. Barb Kruse says neighbors have offered to help weed.
- 8. We avoided prickly shrubs and trees as they gather plastic bags.
- 9. We avoided trees with small leaves as their litter tends to build up and provide homes for weeds.
- 10. Some low, well-behaving grasses would be nice. Tall varieties need trimming at least yearly. Well-behaving ones are those that don't do a lot of reseeding.
